Most endowments are legally restricted in perpetuity, making the sector 'asset rich and cash poor.' Approximately \$1 trillion in personal wealth will be transferred from one generation to the next in Canada between now and 2026 – it is time to rethink perpetual endowments. This 'coffee conversation' will discuss the apportunities and challenges with endowed funds, why the sector is 'asset rich and cash poor,' and what we can do about it. Using live examples, we will talk about modern approaches to philanthropy that enable pathways towards equitable outcomes for communities across turtle island.
